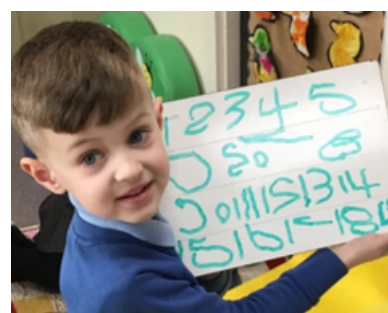
Nursery Fun!

Fingers crossed for sunny weather! We look forward to welcoming you.

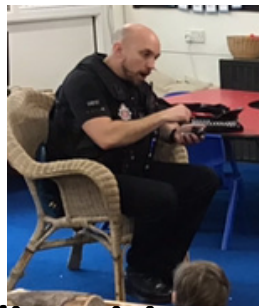
