

Use World Book Week as an inspiration to research an author or illustrator. What inspires them to write or draw? What do like about their work? Why not try to write or draw in their style.

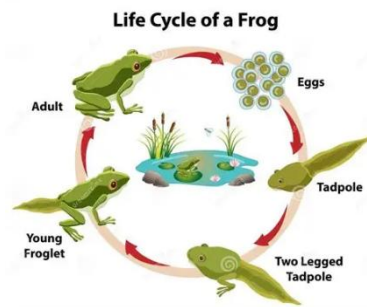
Find out about the lifecycle of an animal or plant. Can you draw and label the different stages? You could try to choose an unusual living thing, or one that not many people know about.
