Research a toy from the past. You could print some pictures and make a little fact file or poster about it. Can you compare it to a toy you play with today? What is the same? What is different?



Interview a relative to find out about the toys they played with in the past. Try interviewing Nans and Grandads or even Great grandparents.

What were the toys like that they played with?

What was their favourite game to play?

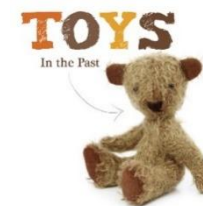
What were their toys made out of?

Where did they play? (inside/outside)

Who did they play with?

Do they have any toys they could show you?

You could record your interview or make a little poster to show what you found out.

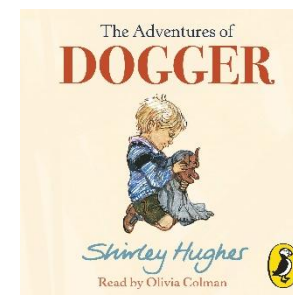


Create a toy from the past. There are lots of ideas and tutorials on the internet. Here are some you could try and make:

It is a story about losing your favourite toy. See if you can write a simple story about losing your favourite toy. You could even have a go at making a 'Wanted' poster to help find your toy. Remember it would need a picture and a description of your toy. You would need to give some details like where it was last seen and whether there is a reward for its safe return.

Continue to practise letter formation and number formation. Lots of us still struggle with this, the more we practise the better we get. You could try doing this in paint, rice, flour, glitter, water and paint brushes etc.

Practise recalling number bonds to 10 and then 20. You can practise recalling them in the car, in the bath or at bed time. The better you know these the easier maths becomes.

Can you practise writing these words in fun ways? For example, in playdough or with paints.
