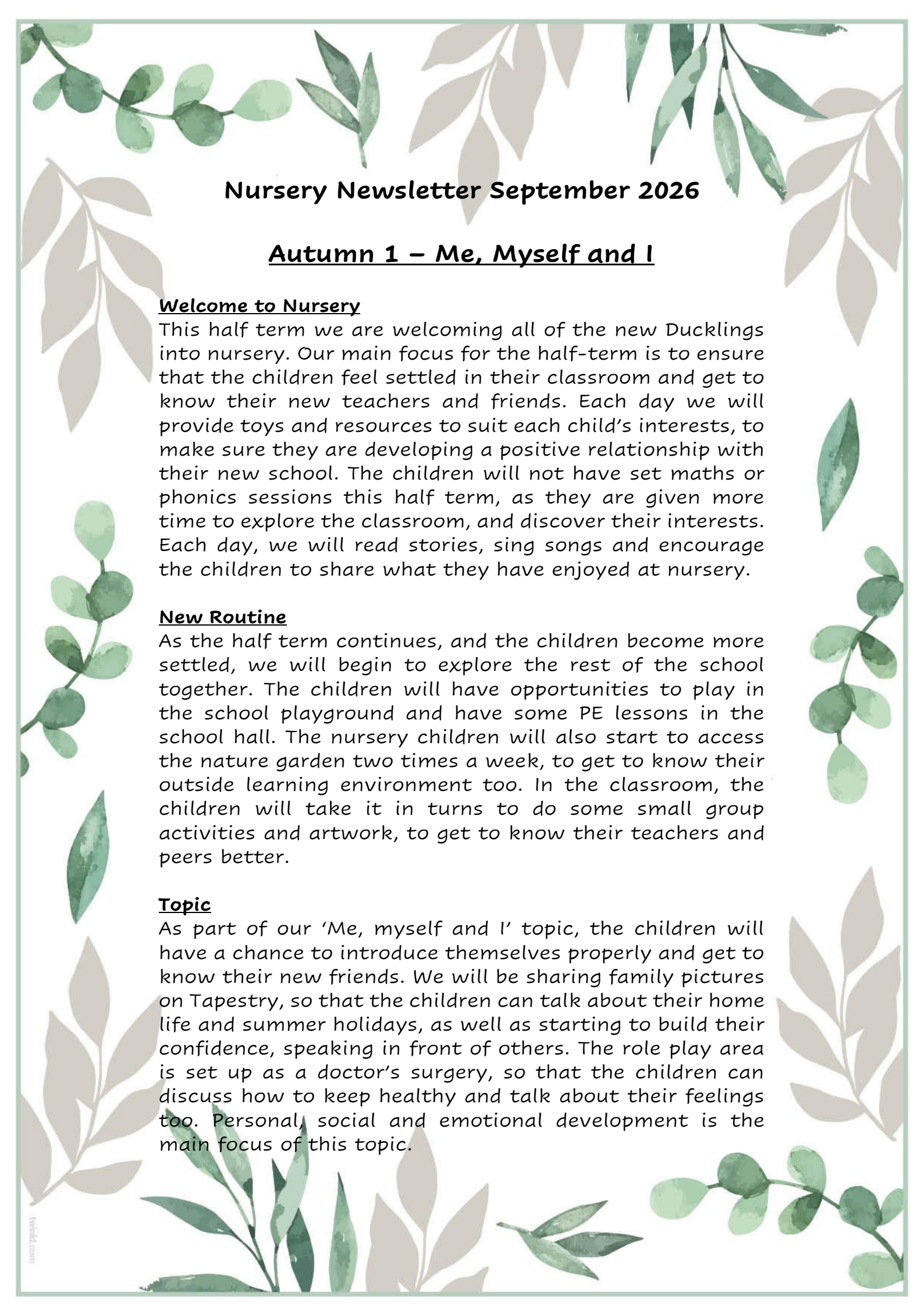

Autumn 1 – Me, Myself and I

Welcome to Nursery

This half term we are welcoming all of the new Ducklings into nursery. Our main focus for the half-term is to ensure that the children feel settled in their classroom and get to know their new teachers and friends. Each day we will provide toys and resources to suit each child's interests, to make sure they are developing a positive relationship with their new school. The children will not have set maths or phonics sessions this half term, as they are given more time to explore the classroom, and discover their interests. Each day, we will read stories, sing songs and encourage the children to share what they have enjoyed at nursery.

New Routine

As the half term continues, and the children become more settled, we will begin to explore the rest of the school together. The children will have opportunities to play in the school playground and have some PE lessons in the school hall. The nursery children will also start to access the nature garden two times a week, to get to know their outside learning environment too. In the classroom, the children will take it in turns to do some small group activities and artwork, to get to know their teachers and peers better.

Topic

As part of our 'Me, myself and I' topic, the children will have a chance to introduce themselves properly and get to know their new friends. We will be sharing family pictures on Tapestry, so that the children can talk about their home life and summer holidays, as well as starting to build their confidence, speaking in front of others. The role play area is set up as a doctor's surgery, so that the children can discuss how to keep healthy and talk about their feelings too. Personal, social and emotional development is the main focus of this topic.
